GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY / VOCATION SUNDAY - 21 APRIL 2024

This Sunday: Acts 4:8-12 : Psalm 118 : 1John 3:1-2 : John 10:11-18 **Next Sunday**: Acts 9:26-31 : Psalm 22 : 1John 3:18-24 : John 15:1-8

In today's gospel, John 10: 11-18, we hear about the shepherds in Israel. In the time when Jesus lived in Israel, there were many shepherds of small flocks, sometimes the owners of the sheep, sometimes hired men. Jesus told the parable of the good shepherd because people could relate to this well. If the shepherd was the owner of the sheep, he would call them by name, take them to the best green grass, lead them to fresh water, defend them when there was danger and if needed, was willing to lay down his life for his sheep. But the hired man would run at the first sign of danger. We can also easily relate to this story - Jesus is our shepherd, we follow him, we trust Him, recognise his voice and believe that we are safe in His Hands. He gave up His life for us. In verse 10 of this chapter, Jesus says that he is not like the thief who comes to kill and steal in the night, but that:

"I have come in order that you may have life, life in abundance".

It is the sentence in this whole chapter that seems to me to be the most significant one. Jesus revealed why He had come. He brought to us the possibilities of life in abundance. His gift to us. The magnitude of this gift is almost too hard to grasp. When we give a gift to a friend, all we look for is that our friend will be delighted to receive it, unpack it, use it and enjoy the gift. We are not looking for anything in return; it is pure gift with no strings attached.


Jesus gave to us all this gift of life in abundance, free of charge. Is living in abundance a possibility? Abundance in this context does not mean possessions, wealth or luxury. It is the quality of living, making the absolute most of every day, developing relationships with people that enrich our lives and using the qualities and gifts God has given to us at every opportunity. Make a contribution to creating a better world. Look forward to being with Him forever.

Our challenge after reading the parable of the Good Shepherd? Let us be good news, instead of just reading about it, and live with great abundance. Jesus gave us the greatest gift possible, we can show our appreciation by living abundantly. We are blessed indeed.
